OTHER IDEAS

There are lots of everyday things you can do to help animals, for example:

- buy products (e.g. make-up and deodorant) that haven't been tested on animals
- go green and help save the planet – cycle or walk instead of travelling in a car; try and buy things that have little or no packaging; recycle household waste such as paper, cardboard, plastic bottles, food tins, drink cans and glass; turn off taps and lights when you don't need them to save water and electricity; don't leave your computer and TV on standby, turn them off at the plugs to save energy
- try and persuade the adults in your family to buy animal welfare-friendly products and food that carries the RSPCA Freedom Food logo (www.freedomfood.co.uk)



- find out about a career in animal welfare (www.rspca.org.uk/careers)
- join the RSPCA and learn how to become animal welfare-friendly. The Animal Action club is ideal for under 13s, and CLAW (Campaign Link for Animal Welfare) is great for anyone aged 13–17. Club members receive *Animal Action* magazine six times a year, packed full of animal stories. *Animal Action* is also available in WH Smith and all good newsagents. 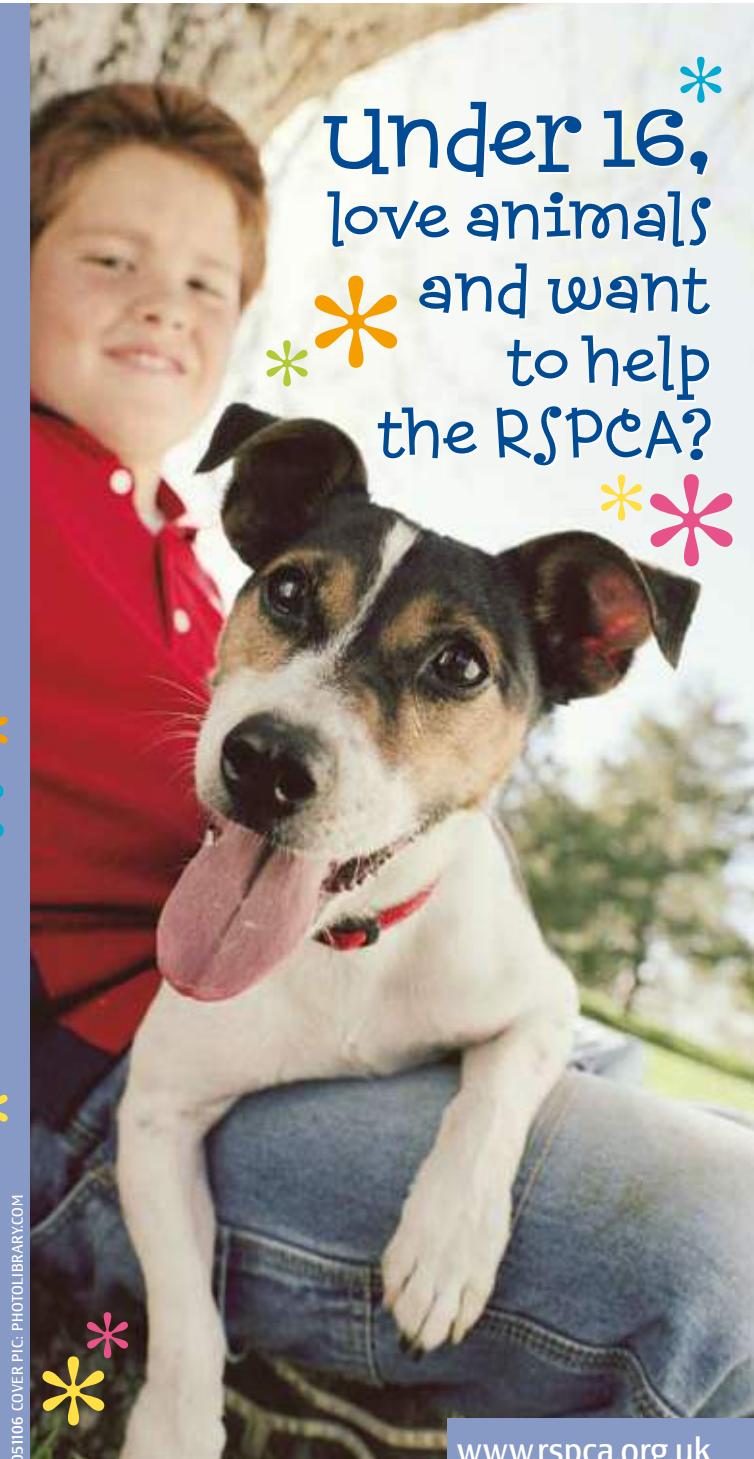

CAMPAIGN VOLUNTEERS – SPEAK OUT FOR ANIMALS

If you're dedicated to improving the lives of millions of animals, why not join the RSPCA's national campaigns network for ideas about how to campaign safely?

Campaigners gather signatures, write letters, send e-mails, hold events, put up posters, deliver leaflets, contact the local press – generally spreading the message locally and rallying support.

You can sign up online, or text* the word **JOIN** to **60022** – to receive monthly e-mails or text messages letting you know how to get involved with RSPCA campaigns. As an RSPCA campaigner you'll receive free materials and giveaways to raise awareness of the campaigns in your area, and six updates a year.

RAPID RECYCLE

Recycling is one of the easiest ways of raising money for the RSPCA, whether it's mobile phones, stamps or printer toner cartridges.

All you have to do is phone the RSPCA (0300 1234 555) and ask for a recycling bag, drop your item(s) in it, then post it off – no stamp needed. Or e-mail: rspcareturns@trf-uk.com



FUNDRAISING THINGS YOU CAN'T DO

There's so much you can do to help the RSPCA and animals, but please remember that under 18s can't:

- collect money door-to-door or in the street with a box
- run a fundraising event alone – there must be a responsible adult (aged over 18) present
- have alcohol on tombola stalls, even if it has been donated by adults
- buy or sell raffle tickets.

Also, if you're hoping to volunteer in an animal centre, the RSPCA prefers volunteers to be 16.

As long as you've chosen a safe and legal fundraising activity and your parents/guardians are happy about what you've chosen to do – and an adult supervises the event – there's no reason why anyone under 16 can't fundraise in aid of the RSPCA.

Once you've collected the money ask an adult to help you fill in the paying-in form at the end of this leaflet.
